RHS Qualifications

RHS Qualifications are highly regarded, industry recognised and OFQUAL approved qualifications from Levels 1-3. Available through our rigorously approved centres around the UK, RHS Qualifications provide learners with an understanding of current horticultural practices with sustainability at its core. With the syllabus written by independent horticultural experts, learners can feel confident that their achievement will be sought after by prospective employers, and is an ideal starting point for career entry, as well as those wishing to extend skills and knowledge for personal interest. Each RHS Qualification is designed to be completed part-time over one year, and depending on the level and certificate, there are flexible study options which include online, face-to-face via blended learning or at an approved centre.

RHS Level 1

RHS Level 1 consists of two qualifications which are aimed at 14 – 19 year olds as well as adults with additional learning needs. It introduces basic learning skills after school as well as growing a foundation interest in horticulture.

RHS Level 2

RHS Level 2 does not require any prior industry experience and is ideal for those learners who are wanting to begin a career in horticulture. Level 2 also caters to those currently in industry wanting to formalise their training with a professional qualification or alternatively are looking to expand their skills for personal interest. It consist of two certificates; the Certificate in the Principles of Plant Growth and Development as well as the Certificate in Practical Horticulture. Although certificates can be achieved separately, it is recommended to achieve both elements to demonstrate the vital skills and knowledge needed to succeed in the modern day workplace.

RHS Level 3

RHS Level 3 is for those already working in horticulture and have ideally completed RHS Level 2 or are wanting to specialise in a particular interest as well as further their knowledge within industry. Level 3 is highly valued and desired by employers and consists of three different qualifications; a practical-based qualification, a knowledge-based qualification and a project-based task based on the learners' interest. It is recommended that those seeking supervisory or management roles will achieve all qualifications to demonstrate competence, confidence and leadership.

Master of Horticulture (MHort)

The Master of Horticulture (MHort) is a Level 6 Award, recognised as a degree-level equivalent, which is designed for accomplished horticulturists wishing to further their knowledge, develop researching capabilities, improve communication and managerial skills, as well as focus on business development. The programme is delivered predominately online via the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) allowing candidates to work flexibly within their own surroundings, and to meet the assessment deadlines from anywhere in the world, running alongside work or other commitments.

The MHort is flexible and delivered part-time over three years. It requires candidates to be motivated and able to undertake focused, autonomous research within a structured assessment environment. The first year helps broaden the candidate's understanding of the horticultural environment and develop appropriate skills to underpin their future research. In the second year, candidates have the opportunity to select scenarios within the assessments to deepen their knowledge by specialising in areas that are of interest and relevant to their careers.

The final year provides the opportunity to demonstrate how to apply acquired knowledge in real-life situations, and to carry out research on a topic of choice, producing a comprehensive Dissertation. As a result of obtaining the RHS MHort award, graduates are able to use the prestigious MHort (RHS) after their name.

RHS Work-Based Training

Spend your days working with and learning from horticultural experts. Choose from a variety of opportunities specially designed to grow your skills.





RHS Level 3 & Level 4 Diploma in Horticultural Practice Both the Level 3 & Level 4 Diplomas are delivered at RHS Garden Wisley only. Students work in the garden (for a salary) and study part time over two years; the students training is funded by the RHS.

These work based qualifications are designed to give a broad overview of the theory and practice of horticulture. Students rotate through 10 departments in the Garden and attend detailed lecture and masterclass programmes by expert Horticulturists who teach students vital work and employability skills at the same time as achieving horticultural expertise. Students need to hold a Level 2 qualification in Horticulture as well as hold previous work experience within the industry before applying.

During the first year, students are given the opportunity to design and tend to their own allotment and are taught a wide range of units such as horticultural operations and garden history, plant care, botany and plant establishment and maintenance as well as garden design.

During the second year, students are given a design and build project and are briefed from a client in the community. The students then design their own garden and pitch this back allowing the winning design to be built together as a team.

Apprenticeships

RHS Gardens provide work based practical training for apprentice Horticulturists, Arborists and Land-Based Service Engineers. This is complimented by college training as required for the relevent Government Apprenticeship Standard.

The Level 2 Horticultural Operative Apprenticeship is available at all five RHS Gardens, provides a unique focus on ornamental gardening as well as plant growth and propagation. The Level 2 Arborist Apprenticeship, available at RHS Gardens Bridgewater, Rosemoor and Wisley allows teams to focus on the development, maintenance and enhancement of trees within a public garden.

Two three-year apprenticeships are available. The Level 3 Horticultural Supervisor Apprentice is available at RHS Garden Rosemoor, providing learners with knowledge and techniques of the seasonal work involved in an ornamental garden such as pruning and irrigation as well as the understanding of how garden teams carry out their work. The Level 3 Land-Based Service Engineering Technician, available at RHS Garden Bridgewater, allows the learner to work alongside experienced mechanics learning how to maintain, repair and inspect the diverse range of machinery and equipment used by horticultural teams.

Professional Work Placements

This specialist Horticultural programme, available at all five RHS Gardens, allows placements to gain expertise in a particular garden department, focusing on a group of plants, garden practice or style within our one-year programme of paid work experience. Placements will assist the horticultural team with day-to-day cultivation and maintenance tasks.

Professional Work Placement applicants need to have completed a Level 2 horticultural qualification such as a National Certificate in Horticulture, Horticulture Operative Apprenticeship or RHS Level 2 Diploma in the Principles and Practices of Horticulture.
