Welcome

At the RHS we believe everybody should have access to gardens and gardening for the benefits they bring – joy and fulfilment, outdoor exercise, stronger communities and thriving environments. This underpins everything we do as the UK's largest gardening charity, and your support as a member is vital

to help us achieve our vision of a world where gardening is embraced as a way of life.

Childhood is the best place to start and introducing all children to gardening – capturing their natural sense of curiosity – is key to a healthier, better future. In a survey of members, helping children and young people reap the benefits of gardening was one of your top three priorities for our charitable work.

We reach 2.2 million children through our RHS Campaign for School Gardening, which provides teachers with free resources and training to bring the joy of plants and gardening into the classroom. Nearly 3,000 schools have signed up so far to the National Education Nature Park initiative, helping connect young people with nature and empowering them to boost biodiversity in their school grounds. More than 50,000 school children enjoy fun, educational visits to our gardens each year, and we're exploring ways to introduce natural sensory experiences to engage the youngest budding gardeners.

Another subject close to our members' hearts is supporting the environment by being greener gardeners. Through our scientific research we're helping the horticulture sector transition away from growing in peat and studying the effects of a changing climate so that we can give science-based advice about creating resilient gardens. How gardeners can help the biodiversity crisis is another area of our research, and a newly updated RHS Plants

for Pollinators list will be launched this year.

To bring gardening inspiration and RHS expertise to more people, schools and communities, especially those that aren't near an RHS Garden, we announced last year that three of our RHS shows will tour to new locations, starting in 2025 with a new show at Wentworth Woodhouse near Sheffield, as RHS Flower Show Tatton Park takes a two-year break. Other new shows will follow in 2026 at the historic grounds of Badminton Estate in Gloucestershire and Sandringham in Norfolk.

Plans at RHS Gardens this year include the redesigned and extended Winter Garden at RHS Garden Rosemoor and a revamp of RHS Garden Hyde Hall's historic Rope Rose Walk.

As well as unlimited, year-round free entry to the five RHS Gardens, members can visit over 230 RHS Partner Gardens in the UK and overseas at selected times, which are all listed in this Handbook, including 15 new additions. 

Covering an area of 154 acres in Salford's historic landscape, RHS Bridgewater is constantly evolving, thriving and inspiring garden visitors, and provides a valuable community resource.

The masterplan, created by landscape architect Tom Stuart-Smith, was brought to life by our fantastic RHS Bridgewater team and award-winning garden designers. Its 'gardens within a garden' concept blends history with world-class horticulture.

One of the UK's largest Victorian walled gardens, the restored Weston Walled Garden showcases Mediterranean, Asiatic and North American planting in the peaceful Paradise Garden. In contrast, the contemporary Worsley Welcome Garden includes beautiful beech topiary, yew domes and billowing herbaceous perennials.

Local groups and school pupils grow together and develop their gardening skills in three community gardens: Community Grow, the Wellbeing Garden and Peel Learning Garden.

The beautiful and productive Kitchen Garden is bursting with inspiration for growing fruit, vegetables and herbs in spaces of all sizes. The naturalistic Orchard Garden is a haven for wildlife and biodiversity, with the addition of a pond started in 2024.

In the centre of the Chinese Streamside Garden is a stunning, sculpted Music Pavilion. Work began in 2024 to create four Elemental Borders themed around air, water, earth and fire.

Children can visit the Blue Peter Garden – Discover Soil and let off steam in the adventure play space in Middle Wood.

Set in the beautiful Yorkshire countryside, this 58-acre family-friendly garden offers streams and lakes, woodland and wildflower meadows, prairie-style planting and moisture-loving plants to reflect and celebrate its location.

Running through the heart of the garden, Streamside is lush with plants that thrive in moist soil. The Main Borders provide spectacular seasonal colour from bold drifts of herbaceous perennials, bulbs and grasses, with the Sun Border a vibrant showstopper.

Take in the stunning lakeside views
from the Thaliana Bridge and be
transported to exotic climes
in the Sub-Tropicana
Garden, which pushes
the boundaries of what
can be grown in
Yorkshire. Relax


with nature in the tranquil Arboretum with a bird hide and wildflower meadow.

The Kitchen Garden is packed with ideas for growing fruit and vegetables, including local and heritage varieties. Exquisite alpine plants bring all-year wow-factor to the Alpine House and newly created alpine rockery.

The on-site Harrogate Arms is now home to an RHS café and visitors can explore the newly designed surrounding landscape.

There are delights in every season, from carpets of snowdrops followed by spring-flowering rhododendrons, camellias and magnolias in the enchanting Woodland, to magnificent border displays in summer and autumn, and the surprising colour and delightful fragrance of the Winter Walk.

The many natural play features for children include the Craggle Top Tree House and Logness Monster.

Situated in the heart of rural Essex, RHS Hyde Hall's 365-acre site makes it the largest of the five RHS Gardens. It's also one of the most visited attractions in the East of England, welcoming more than 400,000 visitors a year.

Its unique hilltop location offers big open skies, sweeping panoramas and far-reaching views across the surrounding countryside. The inspiring mix of horticultural styles provide year-round seasonal interest, and planting styles range from traditional to modern. You'll be enchanted by the exciting spaces, natural beauty and colourful blooms.

The quintessential Hilltop Garden with its scented Rose Garden and colour-themed Herbaceous Border is full of English charm, while in stark contrast the Dry Garden is packed with more than 400 drought-resistant plants from Mediterannean regions, southwest USA, South Africa and Australia.

Brightening even the dullest days, the Winter Garden celebrates the extraordinary colours, textures and scents of plants in winter. Discover a mouthwatering showcase of edibles from around the world in the Global Growth Vegetable Garden.

Inspired by prairie planting, a sea of swaying grasses and perennials fill the large serpentine beds of Clover Hill. The Cottage Garden is beautifully haphazard with favourite garden plants spilling out from the borders and over the paths.

Families and children are encouraged to explore winding paths, roll down hills and run in wide open spaces. Nestled in the trees is Higgledy Hyde, a wooden adventure play area.

Set in the stunning Torridge Valley in the heart of north Devon, between Dartmoor and Exmoor National Parks, this 65-acre haven of biodiversity offers something for everyone. Explore our renowned 'garden rooms', each themed to celebrate the seasons with different planting styles and designs where the plants are always the main attraction.

Our two rose gardens, with over 250 cultivars, are at their fragrant peak in June. Experience a burst of colour and vibrant plants in our Hot Garden or relax among the calming pastels and blues of the peaceful Cool Garden with its teardrop-shaped pond.

Take a streamside walk from the Bog
Garden, through the Rock Gully to the
Lake and enjoy pools, waterfalls and
lush moisture-loving plants.
Explore our woodlands and
wildflower meadows and be

inspired by the Fruit and Vegetable Garden.

Discover trees from all continents of the Northern Hemisphere in the Bicentenary Arboretum and admire our collection of rare and local heritage apples in the orchards.

In the historic part of the garden, around Rosemoor House, the Mediterranean Garden, Exotic Garden, Stone Garden and Cherry Garden provide plentiful inspiration for different growing environments and gardening styles.

Doubling its size and bringing a renewed sense of wonder, the Winter Garden is undergoing an exciting redevelopment, with its new design created by award-winning garden designer Jo Thompson.

Families can let their imaginations run wild exploring our woodland walks and two dedicated play areas. Try your hand at denmaking or follow our leaf-rubbing trail.

RHS Garden Wisley is the historic home of the RHS and one of the UK's most popular and cherished gardens. Covering more than 200 acres, it showcases a huge diversity of gardens and holds one of the world's largest plant collections.

The perfect year-round destination, it has swathes of spring bulbs and beautiful blossom, stunning mixed summer borders, spectacular autumn colour across the gardens, woodland and arboretum, and enchanting frost-dusted winter scenes, with a dedicated Winter Walk. Plant schemes are constantly evolving, so there's always something new to inspire and excite visitors.

Drift through rivers of flowers and foliage in the wonderfully immersive Oudolf Landscape, designed by Piet Oudolf, which opened in summer 2024. Clear Lake, which is both functional and beautiful, opened in 2023 and provides a valuable water storage facility for the garden. The World Food Garden is a triumph of diverse culinary excitement, while much-loved areas, such as the Rock Garden and Battleston Hill, continue to thrive and thrill. A striking lakeside feature, the impressive Glasshouse is home to a diverse range of tender plants from around the world and a dedicated Orchid House. Step back in time in the Old Laboratory and discover the early days of the RHS at Wisley.

RHS Hilltop – The Home of Gardening Science is the UK's first dedicated centre of horticultural scientific excellence and shines a light on the current research of the RHS.

There's ample space for kids to run, play and explore, with the Back to Nature Garden and its natural play features a highlight for families.



- You must show a valid RHS Membership card to enter a garden digital scans or




photos of cards are not accepted. Gardens will refuse entry if you do not have your card or your RHS Membership has expired. Membership cards are not transferable.

Sir Walter Scott created the three walled gardens in the early 19th century, set within a naturalistic wooded landscape beside the River Tweed. For the past 200 years, vegetables, herbs and fruit have been grown here, now complemented by herbaceous borders,

spring-flowering shrubs and a profusion of beautiful roses.

Located in the Cape Winelands, the sprawling 12-acre garden is filled with rambling rose-clad pergolas, gravel pathways and canals irrigating blocks of seasonal vegetables, edible flowers, espaliered fruit trees and berries. There are beehives, fragrant

lawns, a prickly pear maze and a library of citrus, stone and pome fruit trees.
