Stems medium (1.5m). Lvs dark green, deeply cut. Spikes 85cm long, tapering to apex, with c4 lateral spikes (50cm long). Fls semi-double, 80mm wide, pale cream, with a fawn eye. Spurs 20mm long.

('Min' \mathcal{P} × 'Mother Teresa' \mathcal{O}) $\underline{\mathbf{H}}$ (1995), $\underline{\mathbf{G}}$ (1996), $\underline{\mathbf{N}}$ (1998) & $\underline{\mathbf{I}}$ (1998): T. N. Murphy <u>REG</u>: 1998. Stems medium (1.5m). Lvs large, deep green. Spikes 93cm long, tapering slightly to apex, with several strong laterals. Fls semi-double, 78-80mm wide, rich cream, with a deep yellow, well-formed eye (holding colour well in bad weather). Spurs 20mm long. Pedicels 90mm long.
- **'Susan Edmunds'** cl. (Parentage unknown) \underline{H} (1987) & \underline{G} (1988): D. A. Edmunds \underline{N} & \underline{REG} : 1998. Stems short to medium (1.4 1.6m). Spikes 75cm long, tapering to apex, with up to 4 short laterals. Fls fully double, 35mm wide; petals often lobed at apex, inner more-or-less oblong, outer more obovate, light violet (92B), fading towards centre, central petals tinged green; no eye. Pedicels 43mm long.
- **'Vanessa Mae'** cl. ('Silver Jubilee' \hookrightarrow 'Darling Sue' \circlearrowleft) \underline{H} (1993), \underline{G} (1994) & \underline{N} (1998): J. Barrington \underline{I} & \underline{REG} : 1998. Stems medium (cl. 9m). Lvs dark green. Spikes 93cm long, tapering to apex, with several vigorous laterals. Fls semi-double, 95mm wide, petal edges ruffled; inner petals rich violet, outers rich violet with a bright mid blue marking running up the centre to apex; eye dark brown, with numerous, fairly long yellow hairs on the edges. Spur 19mm long. Pedicels 85mm long.
